The Citizens' Police Academy gives participants an opportunity to learn about the day-to-day operations of the Bellefontaine Police Department.

The program provides a unique learning experience. Officers and staff conduct training in areas of their own expertise. Participants become aware of how the police department functions in the community.

The participants gain a practical view of policing and its complexity in these changing times. They obtain a new and informed understanding of the law enforcement profession.

You must be a resident of Bellefontaine **OR** be affiliated with a Bellefontaine business or organization. ***Registration Priority given to residents.*** You must be 18 years old, a criminal history check will be conducted, and you must have **NO** felony convictions. Misdemeanor convictions within the last five years, or multiple misdemeanor convictions, may disqualify you from participation, at the discretion of the Chief of Police. You may be disqualified to participate for any reason at the discretion of the Chief of Police.
