Emailed all a letter to Council from Logan County Metro Housing which is one of many steps to develop housing in our community. The former McBeth School that was on W. Chillicothe Ave. was removed through he Brown Field Grant. The new project will be Chillicothe Cove of 46 units, one, two and three bedrooms. This is not yet a final announcement. It has been at least 15 years since Metropolitan Housing has done any new developments in to our community.

At 5:30 pm this evening a new firefighter was sworn in. Our second female firefighter hire. This is the end result of the SAFER Grant with federal FEMA dollars adding three full time firefighters. With this addition, the department will begin next week with 7, 7 and 7 shift numbers making it the highest staffing level ever in our city.
